Admission Requirements:

- A holder of a Bachelors' Degree, Second Class, Lower Division with at least 2 years of relevant working experience.
- A holder of a Bachelors' Degree with a Pass and at least three years of relevant working experience or Postgraduate Diploma.
- Any other qualification equivalent to the above from institutions recognized by University of Nairobi Senate.

Specifically, many opportunities exist in the local and international NGOs working in peace building projects, post-conflict environments, education in emergencies, relief organizations, the UN and other international organizations, Governments departments and ministries among many other organizations.

INTRODUCTION

The Department of Educational Studies was established in 1988 to offer degree programmes using Open and Distance Learning (ODL) methods and thereby extend the University's educational and training opportunities to the wider population of Kenya. Since then, the Department has carried out this mandate and maintained a leadership position in providing quality education to Kenyans at their door steps by ODL methods.

The reasons for starting the external degree programmes and consequently, the DES were that:

- There were large numbers of candidates who qualified for University education but who could not be admitted because of lack of residential space and limited academic facilities in the University.
- It would give an opportunity to a large number of SI and Diploma in Education holders who were practising teachers to further their education without disrupting their productive employment.
- The external degree programme (EDP) would give an opportunity for reviving Mature Age Entrance Scheme in the University for working people.
- Through the use of distance teaching methods the EDP would provide a cheaper method of providing university education to Kenyans as compared with the conventional mode which involves expensive capital investment.

Courses Offered:

1. Bachelor of Education (Arts) by distance learning

Minimum entry requirement:

- KCSE mean grade C+ (Plus).
- Two Principal passes at A-Level.
- Diploma or SI holders from recognized institutions with KCSE C (Plain)
- P1 Certificate with KCSE mean of C (Plain).
- A degree from the University of Nairobi or any other University recognized by senate.

4. MASTER OF ARTS IN PEACE EDUCATION (MAPE)

1. Introduction:

World-wide, there is recognition of the central role played by education in meeting the complex demands of peacemaking and peace building. Often lacking, however, are individuals prepared with the knowledge and skills to act as leaders of educational reform to support sustainable peace processes. The proposed Masters in Peace Education is designed to build the capacity of educators to contribute to educational, social, and cultural change through peace education. The expected Target group for this program includes teachers and teacher-educators, government officials, NGOs working in the area of peace and security, security agencies among others. The course will be offered through face-to-face and Distance learning modes. The general goal of this course therefore is to prepare leaders and specialists committed to the building of peace and non-violence by educational means in formal, non formal and informal settings.

The key objectives for the MA in Peace Education are:

- To prepare leaders and specialists committed to the building of a culture of peace and non-violence by educational means (formal, non-formal and informal settings)
- To support students in developing competence in analyzing, developing, and reforming curricula, didactic methods, pedagogies, and educational resources for a comprehensive view of peace education.
- Familiarize learners with basic concepts and theoretical frameworks that inform the related fields of peace studies and peace education.
- To support students in developing competence in analyzing conflict situations and transforming those situations by non-violent means.
- Help students in understanding the significant role that can be played by education in relation to challenges to peace facing East Africa and human security in general
